Self Help Workplace will not hire, nor engage for free or paid labour, any child under the age of 17 with the exception of school aged students who may, by signed agreement from all parties, attend the workplace for the purposes of school endorsed work based learning.

Forced or compulsory labour

Self Help Workplace will not coerce nor enforce individuals to work against their will. Terms of cessation of employment is outlined clearly in employment documentation and complies with workplace law.

Discrimination

Self Help Workplace provides an equal employment opportunity policy for all employees without discrimination against race, gender, religion, colour and any disability or impairment.

Freedom of Association

Self Help Workplace staff, employees and volunteers are free to seek advice from or join a union and/or meet with union representatives at the worksite.

Environment

Self Help Workplace will conduct all business with mindfulness to the environment and long term environmental sustainability including, minimising waste, carbon emissions and pollutants and taking steps to continue to protect nature and the environment.
